Jelle Visser is Professor of Empirical Sociology and Chair of Sociology of Labour and Organization at the University of Amsterdam, where he directs the Amsterdam Institute for Advanced Labour Studies (AIAS). He is affiliated with the Max Planck Institute for the Study of Societies (Cologne) and is currently a visiting fellow in the Department of Social and Political Sciences at the European University Institute in Florence. He has worked as a consultant to the Organisation of Economic Cooperation and Development in Paris, the European Commission, the International Labour Organization in Geneva, the Dutch Government, and the Irish National Economic and Social Council. Recent publications include: *Trade Unions in Western Europe Since 1945* (with Bernard Ebbinghaus) in the "Societies of Europe" series of Macmillan, London (2000) and "A Dutch Miracle." *Job Growth, Welfare Reform and Corporatism in the Netherlands* (Amsterdam University Press, 1997, with Anton Hemerijck).
