In 1997, she was Rapporteur of the Working Group on Migration at the UN-Conference on Adult Education (CONFINTEA V) in Hamburg. She has lectured extensively in Europe and Asia. Her research interests include: global feminism, differences among women, globalization and women's empowerment, gender and environment, intercultural education.
