**Colleen A. Dunlavy** is Professor of History at the University of Wisconsin-Madison where she teaches the history of capitalism with an emphasis on the U.S., Germany, and comparative history. She is the author of *Politics and Industrialization: Early Railroads in the United States and Prussia* (Princeton University Press, 1994), which was co-winner of the Thomas Newcomen Prize for the best book in business history published in 1992-1994, and is currently completing *Shareholder Democracy: The Forgotten History* (Harvard University Press), which explores the history of shareholder voting rights in the U.S, Britain, France, and Germany in the nineteenth century. Her research has been supported by the American Council of Learned Societies, the German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD), the German Marshall Fund of the United States, the Russell Sage Foundation, the Alfred P. Sloan Foundation, and the Charles Warren Center at Harvard University.
