Elizabeth Mittman is Associate Professor of German in the Department of Linguistics and Languages at Michigan State University and teaches courses in contemporary German literature and culture, including film, cultural theory, and women's studies. She is co-editor of two books, *The Politics of the Essay: Feminist Perspectives* and *Theory as Practice: A Critical Anthology of Early German Romantic Writings*. She has published on the literature of the former GDR and is currently at work on a project exploring gender and cultural identity in the GDR.

Her research fields include East German literature and culture, gender and identity, Postwar German literature, German women writers, German film, post-colonial theory, and post-unification literature.
