Amy Schalet received a Ph.D. in Sociology from the University of California, Berkeley and a B.A. in Social Studies from Harvard University. Dr. Schalet's research has focused on sexuality, culture, welfare states and the regulation of modern personhood. She has authored several articles on comparative adolescent sexuality and the University of Chicago Press will publish her book, *Raging Hormones, Regulated Love: Adolescent Sexuality and the Constitution of the Modern Individual in the United States and the Netherlands*. For the past two years, Dr. Schalet has held a Postdoctoral Fellowship at the Center for Reproductive Health Research & Policy at the University of California, San Francisco, where she has focused on some of the implications of her research for U.S. public policy and health care practice. Her article "Must We Fear Adolescent Sexuality" was named *Medscape General Medicine's Best Article in Obgyn and Women's Health* of 2004, and is now widely used by educators, policy advocates and health care providers.
