Kathrin Zippel is Assistant Professor of Sociology at Northeastern University. Her areas of research are public and social policy, gender politics, social movements, law, and the welfare state, the social dimension of the European Integration process, and globalization. Her book *The Politics of Sexual Harassment: A Comparative Study of the United States, the European Union, and Germany* is published by Cambridge University Press.

Zippel received her Ph.D. from the Department of Sociology, University of Wisconsin at Madison. Her research has been supported by fellowships of the European Union Center at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. She was a visiting fellow in the Institute for European Politics and Integration at the University of Athens, a fellow at the American Institute for Contemporary German Studies in Washington, D.C., sponsored by the German Academic Exchange Program (DAAD), and a postdoctoral fellow in the European Union Center of New York at Columbia University, and a visitor at the European University Institute at Florence, Italy. She co-chairs the Gender, Society, and Politics Study Group at the Minda de Gunzburg, Center for European Studies at Harvard University.

She has taught courses on the European Union, gender equality politics, social policy, (transnational) social movements, and globalization. Her articles have appeared in the *Social Politics: International Studies in Gender, State, and Society*, *Policy Studies Review* and the *German Forschungsjournal für Soziale Bewegungen* [Journal of Social Movements].
