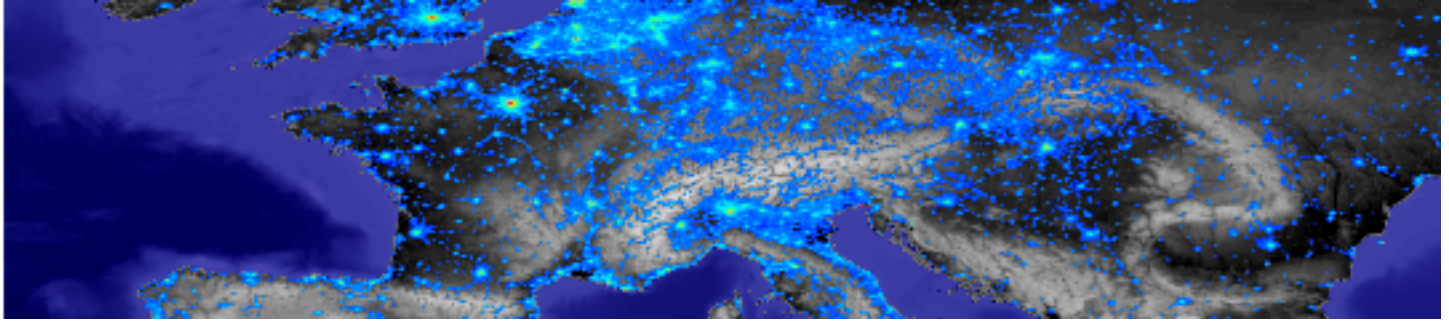

## Marc Abélès

Identity and Borders: An Anthropological Approach to EU Institutions

Marc Abélès is Director of the Laboratoire d'Anthropologie des Institutions et des Organisations Sociales at the Centre National de la Recherche Scientifique in Paris. He is the author of many books, including *Un ethnologue à l'Assemblée* (2000), *En attente d'Europe* (1996), *Politique symbolique en Europe* (1993), *Le Défi écologiste* (1993), and *La Vie quotidienne au Parlement européen* (1992).

Daphne Berdahl is Associate Professor of Anthropology and Institute for Global Studies at the University of Minnesota (Twin Cities). She is the author of *Where the World Ended: Re-Unification and Identity in the German Borderland* (1999) and coeditor of *Altering States: Ethnographies of Transition in Eastern Europe and the Former Soviet Union* (with Matti Bunzl and Martha Lampland, 2000).
